Other topics include:

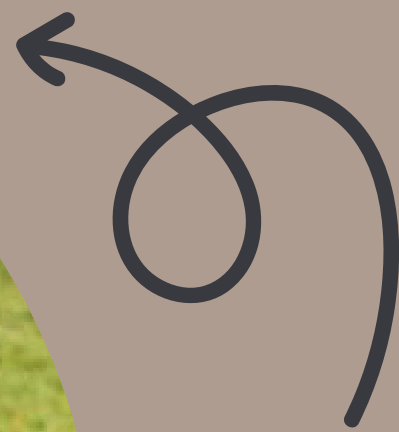

Graduates can apply to use BHU farm land, machinery and facilities to grow confidence in a small commercial-sized garden. The produce is then saleable under the BHU organic land certification.

FAQ

I'm confused, I thought it was free?

We are able to offer our fees-free course in collaboration with SIT's Zero Fees Scheme. There is still a direct materials cost of \$7.00 per credit and our certificates are 50 or 60 credits each.

How much does it cost for international students?

International fees are \$12,500 per certificate. Please refer to SIT's website to see if you qualify for the Zero Fees Scheme.

Do you have any online courses?

No, our certificates are offered Mon-Wed in person at Lincoln, Selwyn. SIT offers their New Zealand Certificates in Organic Primary Production online.

Where is the course?
